2020 Information and Policies

Who can attend Camp Soulard?

- Camp Soulard is for any students entering grades 1 – 6.
- Students work in a mixed-age setting.
- Students with special needs please contact us (see below) prior to enrollment to discuss plans and accommodations.
- For students entering grades 7-12, inquire about our camp counselor program

Schedule:

- The camp day runs from 9:00 – 3:00.
- Drop-in beforecare is available beginning at 8:00 for no additional charge.
- Aftercare is available until 6:00 for an additional \$60 per week.

Tuition and Fees:

- Tuition is \$200/week, with aftercare at \$60/week. An early bird rate of \$175/week applies to all applications received by 3/31/20.
- A non-refundable deposit of \$200 is required at time of registration, which will be credited toward your tuition. If registering by 3/31, deposit is \$175.
- Payment is due in full by June 3, 2020 or can be divided into monthly payments (June/July/August).
- Payments can be made by cash, check (payable to Soulard Education Center) or credit/debit card (3% fee on charges of \$500+). Current TSS families can also pay through FACTS.
- Some small fees or pocket money for field trips may be requested on a weekly basis
- Cancellations: Families are asked to provide 2 weeks' notice to withdraw from a week of camp. If you provide less than 2 weeks' notice, we will be unable to adjust your balance to reflect the cancellation.

Your Child Will Need:

- To bring every day:
 - Lunch and optional morning snack
 - Please do not pack candy or drinks. Snacks should be one of our "Terrific 10" – fruit, vegetables, cheese, hardboiled eggs, hummus, sun butter, pretzels, graham crackers, popcorn or tortilla chips.
 - Water bottle
 - Comfortable walking shoes/sandals (no flip-flops!)
 - Sunscreen and hat
 - Swimsuit and towel on swimming days
 - Backpack
- Additional paperwork (permission slips, doctor's form, etc.) will be sent to you and be due by the first day your child attends camp.
- Please label all items with your child's name!

2020 Session Descriptions

Week 1, June 1-5: Monopoly (Economics)

Everyone has a budget for the week. We will be going to the Soulard Market to purchase food we've never eaten before, opening up a "Camp Soulard Store", learning the fun home economics skills of cross stitching, crocheting, and knitting, and, of course, having a week-long Monopoly tournament!

Week 2, June 8-12: Jenga (Engineering)

Giant Jenga, science experiments, meeting local engineers, and working with the local chapter of Bricks 4 Kidz to build awesome mechanical Lego creations – there isn't anything more fun to kick off the first week of camp than this!

Week 3, June 15-19: D & D (Medieval Times)

For an entire week, Camp Soulard will be transformed into a world of knights, kings, queens, princes, and princesses. There will be dragons, castles, and chivalry. A special guest will lead us in a week-long game of Dungeons and Dragons where we will enter the magical worlds of our imaginations!

Week 4, June 22-26: Jumanji (Camping)

Where s'mores and campfire stories meet a world where animals come alive will be a true adventure! We will play Jumanji (the actual board game), go on a nature scavenger, visit the Zoo and Forest Park, and, YES, we will actually have an (optional) overnight campout on the school's playground at the end of the week.

CAMP CLOSED June 27th through July 12th

Week 5, July 13-17 – Twister (Obstacle Course)

This week will be spent getting planning and building the ultimate obstacle course. Prepare to jump into a giant pool of Jello and race to the finish line! We will also be working with local personal trainers, Gene Slay's Girls and Boys Club, and playing a lot of Twister for strength and conditioning in preparation for the obstacle course of our lives!

Week 6, July 20-24: Clue (Logic Puzzles)

Of course the classic board game of Clue will be played repeatedly throughout the week, but we will also have an ongoing live-action game of Clue acted out among campers and staff. Additionally, we will solve and create riddles for prizes and host a local magician to come and blow our minds!

Week 7, July 27-31: Pie Face (Culinary Arts)

This week is a combination of cooking delicious foods and pie-ing people in the face with whipped cream. All the whipped cream. We will have guest chefs help us cook food from around the world, including pies, and end the week with a pie contest featuring, yes, more whipped cream.

Week 8, August 3-7: Operation (Health)

Though we won't actually be operating on anyone, we will spend this week talking to all types of health professionals – such as doctors, dentists, chiropractors, acupuncturists, massage therapists, therapists – and learning about how our health is holistic. We will also talk about healthy life choices, from the amount of activity we receive each day to what foods we eat, and we will make cards and care bags for patients at St. Louis Children's Hospital.

Week 9, August 10-14: Scrabble (Literacy)

Words and reading open our lives up to so much opportunity. Not only will there be a week-long Scrabble tournament, we will also visit a local bookstore and meet local authors. We will end the week with a "Literacy Slam", where everyone will be able to read or perform an original piece of writing. We'll end our summer with a family potluck dinner on 8/14 with board games and dancing!
