- 4. Guest speaker/Professional Development Shannon Spradling, TSS accountant
 - a. Funding sources
 - i. State funding
 - 1. Based on weighted average daily attendance (WADA)
 - a. If we have 130 kids who attend 90% of the time, WADA would be 117

- b. Currently at 108 based on previous year's attendance our DESE reporting for September is higher, so we will write a request to get paid at a higher rate
- c. If we had a higher percentage of free/reduced price lunch or IEP or LEP populations, we would get additional funding in WADA, but we don't have high enough numbers
- ii. "Local" funding: Prop C
 - 1. Is considered local revenue comes from sales tax
 - 2. Can fluctuate based on sales/economy currently running high
- iii. School level funding grants and gifts raised via Soulard Education Center
- iv. Federal funds:
 - 1. One time funds ESSER funds/other special covid one-off funding
 - 2. "Title funds" Title 1.a, Title II, Title IV.a
 - 3. Special Education funds
- b. Overall we are getting to more stability with state funds as pandemic decreases, and federal covid funding has been a lifesaver for charters and districts across the state.

 - a. Dates are set for equity audit
