FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL ...

Last year we celebrated the **Roots to Bloom** transformation of The Soulard School community. During a bundling session for that year's annual auction, **Patsy King** shared a great quote with me. She knew it from memory, but I asked her to write it down. "If you want to build a ship, don't drum up the men to gather wood, divide the work, and give orders. Instead, teach them to yearn for the vast and endless sea." (Antoine De Saint-Exupery) I kept that small yellow piece of paper on my desk and used it to properly spell the author's name when I copied it to the foyer blackboard on the first day of school this year. At that time, **Jay Gibbs** was hard at work designing and building "Adventure Ship II" for our outdoor classroom. I copied the quote again for the Open House several months later. In December, the launch of our first Annual Giving campaign drew on the analogy. Fittingly, the Soulard Soiree is continuing and completing the year with a grand nautical celebration. When we refer to the Annual Campaign and the Soiree, we have often talked about raising the sails. It may be more accurate to refer to those endeavors - which supplement the school's operating budget so that it can support our sliding scale tuition system - as a means to buy the material and construct the sails. **Money builds a boat, but it can't sail it.**

Have you ever watched a sailing race, or one of those powerful sailing movies? Sailing is not about a big sail full of wind cutting through the blue ocean water. It is about the crew's timing and teamwork required to manage the force of the wind in the sails; adjusting the rigging, rudder, and dagger or centerboard. There is a great deal of responsibility and intensity in those continuous adjustments. It is about harnessing energy and honing experience. There are in essence two sails on a sailing vessel: one capturing the aerodynamic force of the wind in the sail, and the centerboard or hull itself utilizing the hydrodynamic force below the water surface. Sailing requires crews to effectively manage both. In the same manner, the Parent Association and the administrators work together on our ship. This year's officers: Patsy King, Lenny Jones, Beth Hyser, Rhonda Holt, Shannon Chance, Erin Quick, Mary Waskow, and Doug Rassmussen have been steadfast and dedicated sailors. On behalf of the administration, we offer a sincere and humble thank you.

Throughout human history sailing has been instrumental in the development of civilization. Like history's great adventurers, three of the Parent Association officers have been at sea for many years now; Patsy, Beth and Rhonda. They have been instrumental in the development of our community. I share their enthusiasm **looking forward to next year's crew of officers** and deeply thank them for inspiring others to "yearn for the vast and endless sea."






