annual giving

December is the last month in our Annual Giving Campaign. This effort is VITAL to our school's success. Tuition fees cover only 70% of our annual operating budget. The remaining 30% comes from endowments and gifts - including gifts from you. Annual giving can affect our shortfall in two ways: as a direct contribution and as a measure used by foundations, grant underwriters, and benefactors.

As a direct contribution, the annual giving fund can help maintain reasonable tuition rates. Our actual cost per student is \$9,540. Maximum tuition rates are far less. All students, whether or not they are on the sliding scale, benefit from annual gifts. Furthermore, unlike tuition fees, annual giving contributions are 100% tax deductible.

Additionally, the percent of families that contribute to annual giving is used as a measure by foundations, grant underwriters, and benefactors in determining their level of charitable contribution. Before an individual and/or group contributes, they seriously weigh the commitment within an organization before they contribute from outside.

When we are able to boast 100% participation from our families, it sends a clear message of our community's commitment.

Black Bean and Sweet Potato Chili Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- large yellow onion, chopped
- 1 red bell pepper, cored, seeded, and chopped
- green bell pepper, cored, seeded, and chopped
- 2 medium sweet potatoes, diced
- 3 large garlic cloves, minced (about 2 tablespoons)
- 2 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon sea salt
- 2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 1/4 teaspoon dried marjoram
- 1 (14.5-ounce) can diced tomatoes
- 2 (14-ounce) cans vegetable or chicken broth
- 3 (15-ounce) cans black beans, rinsed and drained

Garnishes: chopped fresh cilantro, green onion slices, sour cream

culinary arts recipe



Preparation

Heat oil in a heavy large saucepan or Dutch oven over medium-high heat; add onion. Reduce heat to medium, and cook, stirring occasionally, about 10 to 15 minutes or until tender. Add bell peppers and sweet potato; cook, stirring occasionally, 5 minutes. Stir in garlic, and cook about 1 minute. Add chili powder and next 5 ingredients; stir and cook 1 minute. Add tomatoes and broth. Simmer, uncovered, about 30 minutes. Stir in beans, and continue to cook 10 minutes. Garnish, if desired.
