

The STEAM Lab is a makerspace equipped with state of the art technology where learners of all ages and abilities use multiple disciplines to develop a love of learning and inquire about their world. Students question, wonder, observe, and explore; they create things, both analogue and digital. Our mission is to prime children's brains to think like inventors, designers, scientists, and engineers to prepare them for the many challenges they will encounter in life.

Students learn the importance of perseverance by embracing mistakes as part of the process—try, fail, try, fail, try again, and ultimately succeed at their own pace, becoming skilled with a variety of tools in the process. STEAM Lab experiences are designed to be hands-on and project based. I invite you to participate in the PA and help us define our community and how we support our school this year.



Thrive's Camping Trip to World Bird Sanctuary and Babler State Park


Thrive's current study of the specialized structures of plants and animals brought us to the World Bird Sanctuary and Babler State Park. Students are learning, through these interactive experiences with nature, that both scientists and artists require the ability to be close observers. While at the World Bird Sanctuary, Thrivers participated in a class about birds of prey and then focused on the specialized structures of birds from around the globe. With the help and guidance of Eric Nemens (a Thrive parent) each student brought a camera to photograph birds. The photo journaling continued on a two hour hike at Babler State Park where students used their skills of observation to see nature through a photographer's eyes on the Thrivers' annual overnight camping trip.
