

When we say farewell to graduates, we are frequently also saying farewell to their families...

This year saw the graduation of a number of families that have been at the school prior to The Soulard School opening its doors, or were among the earliest families that helped us to grow our school into what it is now. We call any family that has been at the school longer than 10 years a Founding Family. This title was originally reserved for families that started in our first year, but we have found that being a Founding Family is a state of mind, not a place in time. It is empowering to know that whenever a family joins our community, they know they have an important role to play. We want to acknowledge a group of graduating families that have collectively influenced the school at every level.

The Holloran-Bock Family

Kelly was the founder of The Little School and Gym, where the idea for The Soulard School was born. Co-Founder of TSS and early leader, she made sure the school was a community that her 4 children, Harry, Tedda, Will and Frances, could grow in. Charles was an active member of the PA for many years, serving as Vice President and leading the Oktoberfest fundraiser. In addition the family's grandfather, Jim Holloran, continues to serve on the boards of both TSS and SEC and has been a crucial supporter of the school since its inception.
