OUR GARDEN IN BLOOM

You can see them in the main hallway at school!

Some of the classrooms will use them in the exploration of parts of plants at school. The outdoor gardens are not only used in connection to classroom curriculum but also in the nutrition program, and provide opportunities for study, exploration, reflection and meditation. You may have noticed that because of our limited space, we have utilized the fence near our parking pad. We have hung planters to create a vertical garden on the fence! Here we grow smaller things like lettuces and herbs as well as plants that like to climb like peas and cucumbers. We also have a compost area that we use to support our garden. We often have volunteer plants that come back through the compost. This year we saw butternut squash growing.

The garden is a great opportunity for the Soulard School students to connect and explore plants in a tangible connected manner.

CURRICULUM NIGHT & STUDENT SUPPORT WORKSHOP

Thank you to the parents who joined teachers in September for our virtual Curriculum Nights. We want parents to feel connected to the school and supported in their child's learning from home. Curriculum nights were a chance for parents to hear and ask questions about how distance learning should look. Teachers discussed goals for the year, special projects coming up, and how the individual needs of students are being met during this time. Families met by grade level and in smaller groups where they could discuss what has been working and give feedback on challenges they are facing.

The Soulard School would like to offer parents another time to come together and learn from one another. Kindergarten teacher Amy Cross and a parent volunteer will be holding a student support workshop on October 2lst. Some of the topics being covered include creative and positive

reinforcement at home, how to put your "teacher hat" on, encouraging a growth mindset, and avoiding power struggles.


Drop It Like It's Hot!

Our Fourth and Fifth Graders Tackle Egg Protection

We may be starting the school year from a distance, but that doesn't mean group experiments aren't possible! Our Explorer (4th) and Thrive (5th) friends participated in the classic egg drop experiment as a cross curricular project with a STEAM connection. Students were given parameters for their devices and their completed projects were dropped from the roof of the school. Students had to implement a range of problem solving skills when designing their contraptions and the diversity of each student's thought process shown through in their finished projects. Materials used ranged from pillow fluff and popcorn cushioning to leafy greens for padding and suspension with string for impact absorption control.

The Drop was recorded by the teachers so that students could watch the fate of their eggs from the comfort of their own home with their families. Students were egg-static to see their classmates' designs and predicting whether or not they would survive the fall! The eggs had an approximate 70% survival rate. Pretty impressive! Was it the strength of St. Louis raised chicken eggs? Was it the ingenuity of the materials utilized in their designs? "Omelet" you decide.

Emoji Pancakes from the TSS Kitchen

Our Culinary Arts teachers have been busy at school, making lunch for the in-person learners, but that doesn't mean they're not still teaching ALL our students.

Here are some photos from the latest live lesson, and the recipe for delicious pancakes!

2 cups Flour, SIFTED (don't skip the sifting, it helps make the batter smooth)

- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 Tbs baking powder
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 2 cups milk
- 2 Tbs melted butter

food coloring

3 squeeze bottles for "drawing" non-stick spray for the griddle

Whisk together the first 4 ingredients. Add eggs and milk. Mix until fairly smooth, add melted butter and stir to combine. Divide into three bowls, add desired colors and mix well, then transfer to squeeze bottles (a small funnel works best to help with this). Draw the pancakes of your dreams!

Tips:

Keeping the heat on your griddle or pan low will slow the cooking process, giving you more control and time.

Start with the details first, then layer the background batters on top of them. Even your mistakes will taste delicious!
