


ADMINISTRATION

Research shows that children who read at least 1,000 books before starting kindergarten have greater success in learning to read.



MY OH MINE! EXPLORERS

On Thursday, October 13th, the Explorers 3rd grade class, headed out with their teachers and parent chaperones to visit Missouri Mines Historical Site in Park Hills, Missouri. The trip served as the introduction for the 3rd graders, as they start their study of Rocks, Minerals, the Confluence, and their Impact on the Region. We were able to explore the defunct mine, and we discussed how the old mine worked. Students were able to see the ancient machinery that was used within the 13 mile wide, underground lead mine, including the electric mine trains and shovels.

The Explorers also wandered throughout the largest rock collection in Missouri, with specimens from all over the world, including a black-lit dark room to show the colors of different minerals.

From here, a guest speaker and another field trip will provide Explorers more opportunities to learn about the confluence, as well as , hunt for geodes.

Students are also working to create their own mineral using common household materials for our their very own Mineral Museum in November.

In the Thrive, 4th & 5th grade class, we've been exploring geology and paleontology! After learning that rocks are classified by how they


are formed, we simulated the rock cycle using Starburst candies. Thrivers began with small pieces of candy to represent sediment from weathered and eroded rock.

Using their hands they simulated the processes of compaction and cementation to create a



sedimentary rock.
Thrivers then used their hands to apply the great heat and pressure needed to change their rock into a metamorphic rock.

We also enjoyed comparing the results of different students' rock transformations, and we talked about how these differences exist in real life due to different mineral makeups and changes over long periods of time.



From there, we simulated the melting and crystallization processes using a toaster oven.



The students not only learned about safety in using exacto knives




Thrive student channeling Banksy.

CLASSROOM HAPPENINGS



The school year is in full swing and that means lots of Project Based Learning is happening in STEAM! Here at The Soulard School, we work to have our students develop a strong sense of sustainability and environmental responsibility. Alchemy 2nd grade friends explored green energy and transportation which culminated in a Wind Powered Car design challenge. After discussing a variety of ways that sunlight, water, and wind can be converted into electricity, students were tasked with designing and creating an innovative way to harness the wind as a means of travel. We began by discussing sailboats and various sail designs. Then we added in an exploration of wheel and axles. Students were tasked with designing a mode of transportation that combined their knowledge of simple machines and wind energy.

Using the Engineering Design Process, students made their way through the steps to create prototypes that incorporated wheel and axles with different sail designs to create a vehicle that would travel the farthest distance when placed in front of a wind turbine. A table fan served as our wind turbine for the first level of testing. Students analyzed the durability of their sails and wheel and axle efficiency in front of a low wind fan and made adjustments and improvements as needed. Friends then tried their luck at the high speed station which involved testing their design in front of a blow dryer. Working through the stages of the Engineering Design Process, students build grit as they work through frustrations of failed prototypes and begin to embrace the mistakes as learning opportunities.



Pesto Sauce is a Northern Italian staple made from fresh herbs and greens and toasted nuts. Traditionally, pesto is pounded in a mortar and pestle until pasty, then thinned with olive oil before being tossed with pasta, spread on fresh bread, or used as the sauce base for wood-fired pizza.

This pesto recipe is a favorite at the Soulard School.

We use it on pasta, pizza, in spaghetti sauce, and on Sugarfire Smoked Chicken for our crowd-pleasing Pesto Chicken Sliders. Since it's made in a food processor, even our youngest friends can safely help. Here's my basic pesto recipe and some variations for you to try at home. Pesto freezes beautifully, but needs to be used within a few days if refrigerated.

Note: Any nut can be substituted for sunflower seeds. Pine nuts are traditionally used, but they are expensive.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup fresh Basil leaves, stems
- 3 cups fresh Spinach leaves, stems removed
- Sunflower Seeds, shelled
- $-\frac{1}{2}-\frac{3}{4}$ cup Olive Oil
- 2 cloves Garlic, peeled
- Salt and Pepper

Directions: Put the garlic and sunflower seeds in a food processor and pulse until finely ground. Turn food processor on low and feed the spinach and basil leaves in a few at a time. Slowly drizzle in olive oil until the pesto is smooth and can be scraped into a bowl. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

Variations:

- Add a Tbsp of lemon juice with the salt and pepper for a tart pesto.
- Substitute kale or swiss chard for the spinach.
- Substitute cashews for the sunflower seeds.
- Mix in ¼ cup grated parmesan, asiago or romano cheese at the end.
